Special Agent (SA) Stephen L. Flowers grew up in Virginia and graduated from The College of William & Mary in Williamsburg, Virginia, in 1985. From 1985 to 1987 SA Flowers worked as a middle school teacher in Suffolk, Virginia, and then entered The Southern Baptist Theological Seminary in Louisville, Kentucky, where he graduated with a Masters of Divinity in 1990. SA Flowers served as a church minister in Madison, Indiana, from 1987 to 1996. SA Flowers entered duty with the FBI in January, 1997. He has worked on the White Collar Crime, Violent Crime, and Cyber Crime Squads in the Columbus, Ohio, office and been a member of the FBI Cincinnati Division SWAT. Since 2003 he has been assigned to the Joint Terrorism Task Force (JTTF) in the Columbus office

where he primarily works International Terrorism cases. SA Flowers' current ancillary duties include serving as a relief supervisor for the Columbus JTTF and as an anti-terrorism instructor for law enforcement agencies.

The presentation will primarily be a general overview of radical Islamic terrorism (e.g., the difference between radical and mainstream Islam, major groups and activities, operational indicators) while also providing time for topics and questions relevant to supply chain management.

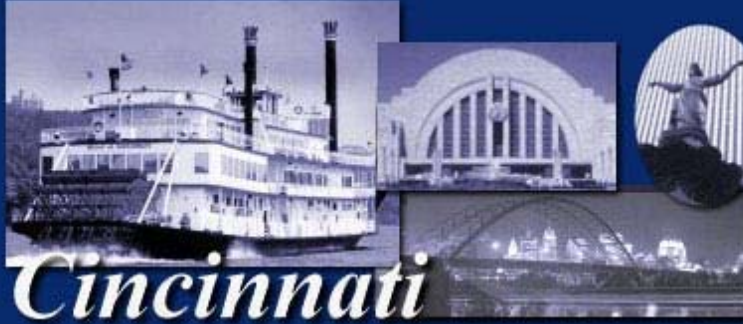

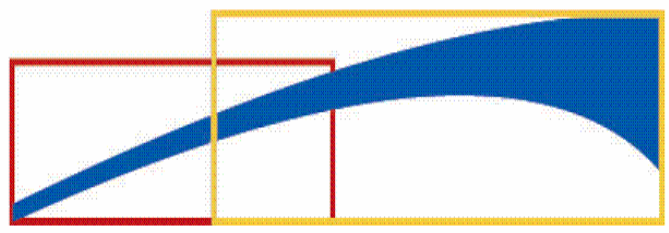
