NAPM-C will tour the Rumpke Sanitary Landfill in Colerain Township from the safety and comfort of a bus. The bus then travels around the landfill while the guide shows exactly what happens after the garbage leaves your homes and business. Learn about Methane gas removal, leachate collection, surface water controls and other points of interest. The tour concludes with an explanation of the final landfill

cover and cap and the future uses of the landfill property.

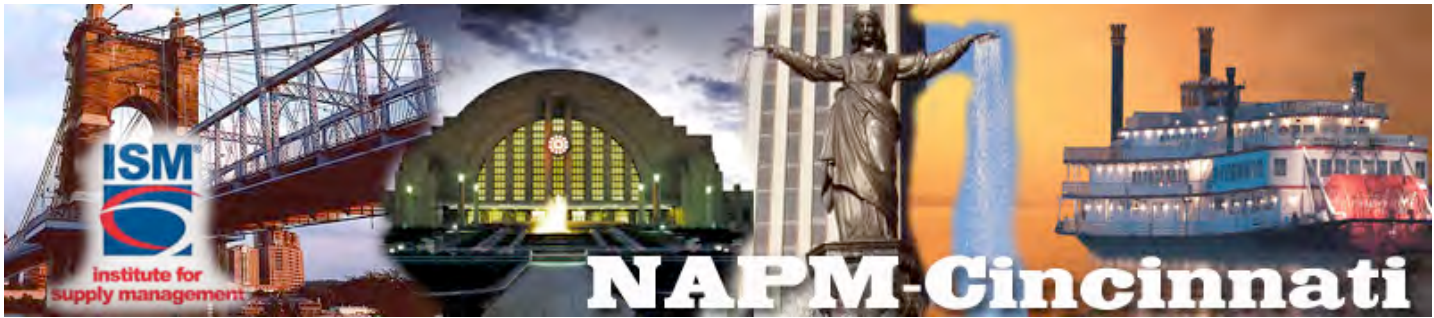
ELECTIONS FOR THE BOARD OF NAPM-C

Ellen Feyka is the Corporate Purchasing Manager for Service Solutions Group, a national premier foodservice equipment repair company.

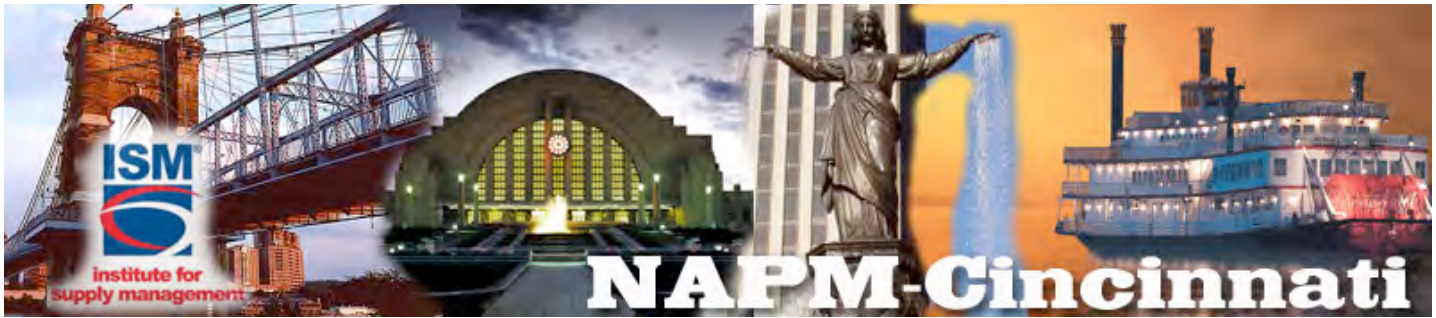

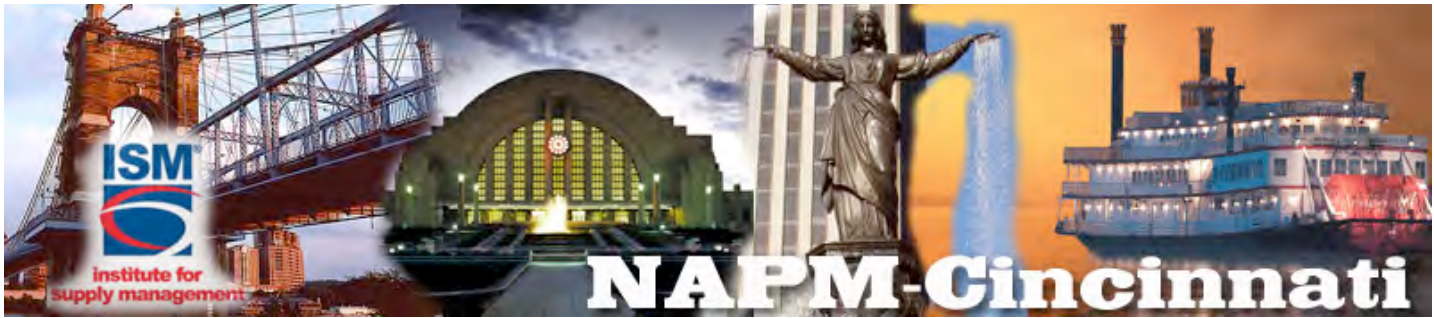
Director

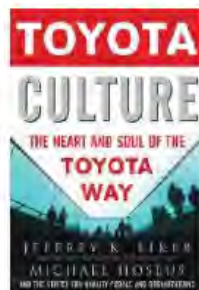
